COURSE CONTENT

The demands of modern day trauma team leading and management has changed significantly. 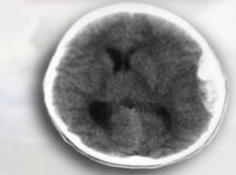
Subjects covered:

- Trauma analgesia, sedation and anaesthesia
- Damage Control Resuscitation & Damage Control Surgery
- Major Haemorrhage control and fluid resuscitation
- Traumatic Cardiac Arrest; The New Guidelines
- Thoracotomy
- Management of penetrating injuries
- Damage Control Surgery

Practical sessions include:

- Administering blood and using rapid transfusion devices
- Use of Haemostatic agents
- Novel iv access devices
- Thoracotomy procedure
- Spinal immobilisation; minimal movement, maximal safety techniques
- Splints and traction devices

The course is presented by current practising experts via lectures, written protocols, practical skills sessions and simulation based scenarios.
